Three Components:

Because there are so many ways to show our appreciation, the project consists of three parts:

- **"Thank You" Programs:** Programs to show appreciation for individuals who your club wishes to honor through awards ceremonies, community appreciation nights, new member installations, and any other recognition events.
- **"Thank You" Letters:** Formal letters of gratitude that can be written to show appreciation to people or groups who gave donations, Kiwanis for monetary and/or moral support, those who serve our country with the military, and anyone else who your club wishes to recognize.
- **New York District Circle K's Worldwide Service Project Medal:** An award designed to be purchased by you or your club and given Circle Kers, Kiwanis Family members, or members of the community to recognize them for their contributions. Proceeds from this award will be donated to The ELIMINATE Project, Kiwanis International's Worldwide Service Project to Eliminate Maternal/Neonatal Tetanus.
